## Home & Community-Based Services

### PASSPORT Program

PASSPORT offers in-home alternatives to nursing home care for qualified low-income older adults. Services include personal care, homemaker, respite, adult day care, and consumer-directed care. Consumer-directed care offers consumers the opportunity to employ individual providers and direct their own care.

These services help individuals remain independent longer and relieve some of the burden from caregivers. We assign a care manager to work with the family, physician, and home health workers to customize a care plan. Plans may consist of services including home-delivered meals, personal care, chore service, emergency response systems, home medical equipment, transportation, and more.

### Assisted Living Waiver Program

This program pays for a variety of services. Participants may be eligible for a one-time allowance for costs to move to an assisted living facility. All participants receive a Medicaid card to access physician and nursing services, therapies, and other services.

### Caregiver Advocacy Program

Many with long-term care needs rely on family and friends to provide assistance. This program addresses needs of informal caregivers with a resource library, options for respite care and other support programs. We also offer Project Lifesaver, a rapid response search and rescue service designed for individuals with Alzheimer's, Down Syndrome, Autism, traumatic brain injuries, and cognitive impairments who wander.

### Home Accessibility Modification & Minor Home Repair Program

The goal of this program is to enable eligible persons to "age in place" through changes to an existing bathroom; providing wheelchair accessibility; or repairs to a roof. Income-eligible homeowners 60+, or those with a disability at any age, with homes needing modifications or repairs and who are income eligible may receive assistance.

### Home Choice

Individuals 60+ and people of any age with disabilities who wish to move from long-term care facilities to qualified home and community settings can benefit from Home Choice.

The program supports individuals as they transition and connects them to community services such as health care, pharmacy, household items, and more.

### Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program

We advocate for quality care and negotiate for solutions to problems that arise between providers and consumers of long-term care services. A key feature of this program is a dedicated group of volunteers who regularly visit long-term care facilities and assist families to fully understand the issues they face.
