Information & Referral Services

Home & Community-Based Services

PASSPORT Program

PASSPORT is an in-home alternative to nursing home care for Medicaid eligible adults 60+. Services include personal care, homemaker, respite, adult day care, home delivered-meals, emergency response systems, home medical equipment, transportation, and consumer-directed care. These services help individuals remain independent longer and relieve some of the burden from caregivers.

Assisted Living Waiver Program

Based on care needs, Medicaid qualified recipients age 21+ may be eligible to reside in a participating assisted living facility. This waiver provides financial assistance for cost of care.

Caregiver Advocacy Program

Many with long-term care needs rely on family and friends to provide assistance. This program focuses on the caregiver's needs: providing a resource library, options for respite care and other support programs. We also offer Project Lifesaver, a rapid response search and rescue service designed for individuals with Alzheimer's, Down Syndrome, Autism, traumatic brain injuries, and cognitive impairments who wander.

Home Accessibility Modification & Minor Home Repair Program

The goal of this program is to enable eligible persons to "age in place." Income-eligible homeowners 60+, or those under 60 with a disability, with homes needing modifications for disability access or emergency repairs may receive assistance.

Home Choice

Individuals 60+ and under 60 with disabilities who wish to move from long-term care facilities to qualified home and community settings can benefit from Home Choice. This program supports individuals as they transition and connects them to community services such as health care, pharmacy, household items, and more.

Health and Wellness Programs

Get connected to evidence-based health and wellness programs, including self-management of chronic disease, pain, diabetes, and falls prevention.
